# NEW CHURCH FOR KANSAS CITY

At last, after waiting patiently for many years, the Kansas City brethren were able to assemble together to hear the Word of God expounded clearly and effectively. For the first time in this era of God's Work the Kansas City area has a church!

Many of these brethren have been members of God's Church for years. Fellowship was limited to attending services in Springfield and the annual festivals in Texas. Many of these faithful brethren prayed that God would raise up more churches, that He would provide for our every need. And these prayers were answered!

On October 7, 1961, the very first Sabbath after the Feast of Tabernacles, the Kansas City Church began. Arising early on the Sabbath, before dawn in some cases, the brethren for miles around hurriedly prepared in order to be present for the 9:00 morning service.

Three of God's ordained ministers, Mr. Roderick Meredith, Mr. Bryce Clark, and Mr. Dale Hampton, were present for the opening Sabbath. Seated in chairs before them were 270 eager listeners. Mr. Hampton led the singing, Mr. Clark gave the sermonette, and Mr. Meredith preached a powerful sermon on "What is the True Church of God Like?"

Immediately following the sermon, Mr. Clark had to rush to Springfield to hold the afternoon Sabbath services. Mr. Meredith and Mr. Hampton remained to answer questions, council, and anoint any who were sick.

After visiting old acquaintances, meeting new friends, and seeing new faces for the first time, the brethren slowly adjourned to their respective homes - each looking forward to the next Sabbath Day, indeed thankful for the blessing of a local church in Kansas City.



### FEAST ...

- Squaw Valley, California by L. E. Stuart



A person making his first trip to the west and specifically to Squaw Valley might upon reaching Reno, Nevada become quite apprehensive. After having traveled through Utah and most of Nevada, and having seen virtually nothing except barren mountains with sage brush dotted dessert, one begins to wonder if he has been living with a misconception as to the type of beauty to be found at Squaw Valley At Reno and though only a stones throw from Lake Taho and Squaw Valley the scenery still has not changed noticeably. Within a few moments after leaving Reno, however, the transition in scenery takes place so suddenly it is like awakening from a bad dream. The beauty now is as you might have imagined, except more so. For words and pictures simply do not convey the magnitude of the forces directed by Almighty God in presenting these examples of His handiwork.

The accomodations, the atmosphere and even the weather this year seemed to be designed more for this great Festival than for the Winter Olympics of 1960. The weather, though very cool in the late evenings, was bright, clear, clean and invigorating. The only shower which I was aware of came and left during the night, leaving a refreshing atmosphere for the next day. There is one thing quite evident throughout the area however, and that is the very real shortage of water. Lake Taho, even though striking in it's beauty, is about four feet below normal and

considering the many miles of lake surface, constitutes a great shortage of water.

Bulldozers are almost constantly at work smoothing the ski-runs. Because of the lack of normal snow fall the runs are becoming dangerous and must be levelled to make them usable. (Who knows by what methods God prepares accomodations for His people.)

By the early part of the Feast orderliness was established and numerous opportunities were presented for spiritual growth and physical enjoyment. This reporter found volunteers for the work details to be most cooperative and eager to serve in keeping the camp of Israel presentable before the Living God.


The building used for the tabernacle is well designed for our purpose with a spacious foyer and two wide concrete stairways leading to an upper landing and a huge balcony which accomodated more than half of this year's congregation. Rest rooms are conveniently and almost extravagantly distributed in both upper and lower portions of the building. The main floor of the building, which was designed for the Olympic ice-hockey arena, along with the spectator boxes accomodated the remainder of the congregation.

The prevailing atmosphere of the entire Squaw Valley area as far as arrangement and design of buildings are concerned, is unmistakeably that of a plush resort. Indeed, quite some distraction was encountered from wandering tourist, who, under the circumstances, had to be handled very diplomatically.

The meetings were dynamically alive with spiritual food and an abundance of both spiritual and physical blessings

Being able to attend the Feast at Squaw Valley and to recognize the great potential this place holds for God's people, my sincere hope is that suitable arrangements can be made for an even greater Feast there next year.

There are Seven Characteristics that set God's people apart.

1. God's people will recognize God as SUPREME RULER in their lives.

It will be a Commandment keeping church as stated in Rev. 12:17, but even more so will not be living by bread alone, "but by Every Word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God." (Mat. 4:4)

X7. God's church and God's people will possess THREE OUTWARD SIGNS.

(a) the Sabbath; (b) the Holy Days; (c) the Correct Name.

In Exodus 31:13 we find that the keeping of the Sabbath is a sign between God and His people to be kept throughout their generations.

The Sabbath and Holy Days stand or fall together. "Let no man therefore judge you in meat, or in drink, or in respect of an holyday, or of the new moon, or of Sabbaths." (Col. 2:16) Jesus kept the Holy Days and Sabbath as found in many New Testament Scriptures.

As to the third outward sign of God's people, there are twelve separare scriptures in the New Testament that say the true church will be called the Church of God. (Acts 20:28; I Cor. L:2; I Cor. 10:32; I Cor. 11:22; Gal. 1:13 etc.)

3. God's people know the truth of the PAGAN DOCTRINES.

Immortality of the soul, going to Heaven or Hell are but two of them. If any man would have gond to Heaven, it would have been David, a man after God's own Heart and yet we find in Acts 2:29 and Acts 2:34 the very oppo posite to be true.

4. God's people have GOD's POWER.

"For God hath not given us the spirit of fear, but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." (2 Tim. 1:7) Our human mind is full of excuses and the only way we can overcome it is to have God's Spirit.

5. 6 J's people understand GOD'S HEALTH LAWS. This includes the clean and unclean meats of Lev. 23 and Deut. 14. We need to be clean in all phases of our lives - our houses, our bodies as well as foods. We need plenty of fresh air, sunshine and exercise, for if we are not healthy we cannot accomplish God's work.

6. God's people understand BIBLE PROPHESY.

This is the only church that has given prophesy down through the years. If you understand the Bible and do God's Will, you can escape the coming tribulations, for "surely the Lord God will do nothing, but he revealeth his secret unto his servants the prophets." (Amos 3:7)

7. And finally, God's people have TRUE SPIRITUALITY.

You will know where you are going. You will have a purpose in life. "and that ye put on the new man, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness." (Eph. 4:24) You will then be happy and show it on your face.

Yes, you can know where God's Church is and who are His people.

May God grant you the understanding and the desire to seek, to find and obey, that it might be well with you hand and your children.


They are doing well. Mrs. Flaugher is excellent. However, Mr. Flaugher has not quite recovered from the shock.
